


# What is the 3MT Competition?





## Structure...

Broad problem area/motivation – why? Research question/problem statement – what? How you did it /methodology or approach – how? Findings Conclusion/implications





## **1. Rules of Presentation**

- Only a single static PowerPoint slide is permitted - Presentations are limited to a maximum of 3 minutes and contestants who exceed 3 minutes will be disqualified.
- No reading of notes is allowed.
- No slide transitions, animation or 'movement' of any description are allowed.
- No additional electronic media (e.g. sound and video files) are permitted.
- No additional props or equipments (e.g. costumes, musical instruments, laboratory equipment.) are permitted.
- **Presentations** are to be delivered orally (eg. no poems, raps or songs).
- Presentations are to commence from the stage.
- Presentations are considered to have commenced when a presenter starts his/her presentation through either movement or speech (the bell will be rang once)

## **3MT RULES**



### 2. Time Alert

- Start: The bell will be rang once
- End: The bell will be rang 3 times
- \* continues, he/she will be **disqualified**.


## DRESS CODE

- 8. For male students, HAIR MUST BE NEATLY, TRIMMED and REASONABLE IN LENGTH, COLOURING and




